What is the Seal of Biliteracy?

"The Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by a school, school district or county office of education in recognition of students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation. The Seal of Biliteracy takes the form of a gold seal that appears on the transcript or diploma of the graduating senior and is a statement of accomplishment for future employers and for college admissions. In addition to the Seal of Biliteracy that marks attainment of high level mastery of two or more languages, schools and districts are also instituting **Bilingual Pathway** Awards, recognizing significant steps towards developing biliteracy along a student's trajectory from preschool into high school."

Last year Fuller, Woodrow Wilson, and FHS piloted the <u>Seal of Bilitera-</u> <u>cy program</u>. English Learners (ELs) and Former English Learners (FELs) who had scored a 5.0 or above on the ACCESS English Language Proficiency assessment, and a 4 or above on PARCC ELA were awarded a certificate of biliteracy. The purpose of the certificates at the elementary and middle levels is to recognize the achievement of students who demonstrate proficiency in more than one language. It is a very prestigious honor and we are so fortunate to be in a state that recognizes the double-effort made by students who become academically proficient in more than one language.

Since the certificate and seal are not just for ELs or FELs, but is available to any student who can demonstrate academic proficiency in multiple languages, the district Bilingual Education Department has been working in conjunction with other departments to clarify the requirements that students must meet in order to be eligible. Currently, the criteria is as follows (although may be subject to change as we continue to work on this pilot program):

English Learners:

- 5.0 or above overall proficiency level on ACCESS
 - FELs: Equivalent ESL-exit criteria if there are no ACCESS scores
- Academic proficiency in another language as measured by a native language (LAS) exam
 - FELs: World Language portfolio in partner language (Spanish or French)

Native English Speakers

- Meet or Exceed state assessment criteria
- World Language portfolio in partner language (Spanish or French)

The approach of December and Winter break has not phased students of the Tangerine Team as they continue to forge through their classes and put forth their best effort!

In Math class most students are working on their Rational Number skills. They are building their understanding of how to complete all operations with positive and negative rational numbers, including decimals and fractions. Soon they will take all of their computation knowledge and use it to solve real-world problems and scenarios so they can make connections for where they will see this type of math in their lives. Some students have completed this unit and are now working on

Blue Team

It's finally December! Where have the first three months gone? As the saying goes, time flies when you're having fun and that's what is happening here on the Blue Team along with much learning, of course! Most of our 8th graders are really settling in as 8th grade students and showing us that they are getting ready for high school. If you're not seeing it at home yet, that's okay. It is easier for us as we interact with the collective group on a daily basis. This transition does happen gradually, and for some, it happens faster than others. But please trust us, it does happen for all of them eventually. Be patient!

As teachers who enjoy working

their Expressions and Equations. Students are beginning to generate equivalent expressions with algebraic techniques. Soon they will be able to use these techniques to write and solve equations. The students in Ms. Ritter's Science Class carried out an "Osmosis Gummy Bear Activity". The purpose of this activity was to teach students how to conduct scientific investigations and gain a better foundation of the metric system. The students used components of experimental design to practice using the metric system for measuring as they learned volume, mass, and density. The students were able to design and implement experimental

procedures when given a problem. It was rewarding to taste a few of the left over gummy bears! In Social Studies students have started their Mesopotamia Unit. The students are learning about the beginning of civilization and what the key characteristics of a civilization are. Their studies are focused around the essential guestion: "what does a civilization need to be successful?" Students will begin to recognize that all successful civilizations contain the following five components: government; religion; writing; social structure, jobs, and food supply; art, culture, and technology. This unit will carry us through the holiday season. The first week back from winter break we will be diving into our new unit: Egypt!

with this age group, we understand the importance of consistency, routines, and laughter. We're putting much effort into bringing best practices into each team classroom for the benefit of the students. In addition to our curriculum, we're working on effective classroom management practices across the team that ensure safety and respect for all students. Because we always want our students to perform at the highest level they can, we are sharing ways to challenge their thinking and to make that thinking visible in a variety of ways in each class. Furthermore, we are continuing to develop special opportunities to recognize and promote positive behaviors across the team, whether class based or as a full team. Using the school-wide PBIS blue ticket system, we are creating methods to celebrate the students in a meaningful, fun, and consistent way.

Lastly, as a full grade in mid-November, we went on an informational visit to Keefe Tech. The students made personal choices to investigate and learn about three of the many career offerings at the school. It was a worthwhile trip, as the students were eager to ask questions and engage in important discussions when we returned to school. Fuller students are lucky to have many choices for high school and as their teachers, we're happy to help them talk through the possibilities so they make the decision that is right for each of them.

Green Team

On November 3rd the Green Team held a community meeting and decided to undertake a very personal and meaningful challenge. They claimed ownership of the Fuller Family Food Drive. Every year the students and faculty at Fuller Middle School try and help their own by raising money and collecting food for some of the less fortunate families that may need assistance during the holiday season. The Lime.com Team has been involved in many exciting learning experiences. Mrs. Hakar's Math class just wrapped up lessons on division of fractions. Before the Thanksgiving break, they continued to work on their STEAM projects by beginning to design their food trucks and choosing a company name. Last week in Mrs. Rogan's Science class students learned to read liquid volume measurements in a variety graduated cylinders with different increment values. They also determined the volume of different rocks using the displacement of water method. This week students began researching a water or wind erosion/ deposition assigned topic and creating a slide presentation. In Mrs. Bonner's ELA class, students have begun a new unit where they are learning how to write literary analysis essays. It has been great to see all of the effort students are putting into their writing! Students in Mrs. Bonner's Social Studies class have begun a new unit learning about South America. Students have been creat-

ing detailed political and physical maps of South America. Students in Mr. Zieky's Social Studies class spent Monday learning about the history of Cuba and Fidel Castro. On Tuesday, students began their South America unit, highlighted by the upcoming Amazon Rainforest conference debate. During a recent FLEX Block teachers helped students to organize their binders and homework folders. The guidelines for organizing binders and folders were sent home with the students.

Opal Team

Science

November has come and gone like glacial erosion. Opal students have now started into their Inside Earth textbook where we will be learning about convection currents and plate tectonics. The lava lamp will be a staple in my classroom to work as a visual cue for the three types of heat transfer: radiation, convection and conduction.

Math

In the first trimester of math we have made our thinking visible through showing our fraction and decimal operations with area models, inverse operations, and ratio tables. As we have learned and developed these skills we

Language Arts classes are exploring and learning through realistic fiction and nonfiction texts. Continuing to build vocabulary will be important as we go through this learning adventure. Students will also continue to practice their writing through written responses, journal writing, and practicing writing through more formal writing assignments. Additionally, be on the lookout for chosen library books that students will read at home and/or in school. Students will create their own reviews based on their opinions of their chosen books. Book returns take place on day 2 of our six day rotating schedule.

In Math, students are exploring operations with fractions, They are learning about identifying fractions, ordering fractions, and will eventually be learning about mixed numbers and improper fractions. In Social Studies, students are learning about the rights and responsibilities of a citizen. They are learning what it means to be a citizen, how to become a citizen, and how to be an active citizen in the community. We continue to watch CNN Student News each day to keep aware of what is happening in the world and be good global citizens.

In Science the Patriots and the Red Sox are learning all about cell theory, the parts of a cell, and how cells are connected to all living things. The Bruins are learning about how we use of 5 senses to interact with our environment.

Students were active citizens of the Fuller community by helping to sort and deliver pie orders. Be on the lookout for new Fuller wear. We will be helping to organize the order for the new Fuller wear styles.

have continued to apply them to our STEAM Food Truck project. We have created signature drinks with ratio tables and equations to calculate the amount of product needed for them. Our food truck business is growing and we have started to design the actual food truck. In the beginning of November we wrote letters to Food Network telling them about our businesses and our STEAM projects. In the next trimester we will be developing our fractions and decimal operations, and begin looking at order of operations.

ELA:

First trimester has quickly come to an end in Language Arts. We

have just finished our Folktale unit by writing original folktales. We are beginning our new unit, Literary analysis where we will be analyzing short stories and writing arguments about characters and themes. Students will learn strategies to gather, analyze, and explain evidence from the text to support a claim.

Social Studies

In Social Studies students are identifying the countries and capitals of their first continent of study and creating both physical and political maps of the continent. Students are studying with Mr. Keady Europe and South America with Ms. Dunne and Mrs. Gelardi.



Gold Team

What's happening in TBE Spanish Science classes with Mrs. Meléndez? Lots of learning and projects. The 6th grade TBE Spanish Science class has been studying about the history of the Earth, rocks and fossils. In the past weeks we have made different types of models of fossils and this week we are making edible ones! Throughout this trimester we have focused on using graphic organizers and outlines as a study strategy. The 7th grade class is learning about cells. We worked on making a timeline, a poster and a chart to represent graphically what we are learning. Now we are studying about cells but in English. So far it really is going well. It's not even as hard as we thought! We are learning to rely on cognates and reading strategies to help us with the English. And in the 8th grade class, we are learning about matter. We have done some

fun activities to learn about the stories. structure of the atom and about the properties of matter. Maybe the best one was our Density Lab. We got to chew gum! We can't wait to get into the lab and do some more real science experiments! In the next weeks we will continue talking about physical and chemical changes in matter. In addition to all this science learning, we are doing some unit work in English and we are integrating math concepts and review as we go along.
